DCS of Yesterday ... Dansville's first school opened in 1798 and many small schools emerged in the area over the next several decades. In 1885 the school was registered with the New York State Education Department and approved to grant diplomas. In 1926, a Central School District was created as the schools of North Dansville, Town of Dansville (Steuben County) and West Sparta combined to become one. As the population continued to grow, a new elementary school was built which opened in 1953; a new high school was built and opened in September 1965; and, a new Primary School opened in 1968.

**DCS of Today** ... Dansville Central School District is geographically among the largest districts in New York spanning approximately 125 square miles crossing two counties. Our area is rich in agriculture and about half our students reside in the rural areas outside the Village.

**DCS of Tomorrow** In 2023, the District is focused on and committed to long term efforts to engage members of the school community, promote learning, and elevate our regional status as a learning institution. We view such efforts and successes as essential in shaping the future of our children, rebuilding our local economy, and attracting more families to our community.
